We hope to receive manuscripts representing all viewpoints and subfields of study regarding this broad topic. Regardless of the topic, we do ask, given the scope of the journal, that all papers include (at the very least) a section that focuses on pedagogical implications.

The deadline to submit completed papers is **May 30th, 2016**.

Other tentative deadlines to consider:

- August 1st (2016), reviews sent to author(s).
- November 1st (2016), revised manuscript sent to guest-editor; sent out for 2nd review if needed.
- October 15th (2016), final version due to editor.
- December (2016), expected publication date.

Within the body of the e-mail message, please include the submission’s title, the author’s full name, institutional affiliation, and contact information (including a current telephone or cell phone number), along with written assurance that the article is original, unpublished, and/or not currently under review with any other

journal. In the email message you may also suggest reviewers for your manuscript or request that we not consider certain reviewers. Within the attached MS Word document, indicate the article's title at the top, and please remove any references to the author's name, institutional affiliation or any other identifying information. Authors should include a brief abstract of the article (150 words maximum) at the top of the manuscript.

Articles may be written in English or Spanish and should be between 6,000 to 8,000 words, excluding the abstract, notes, and bibliographical references, twelve point font, double spaced. HSR uses footnotes, not endnotes. Quotations provided in languages other than English or Spanish should be included in the original with a translation into the primary language of the article immediately following the quote. All manuscripts should include a list of Works Cited. For linguistics articles, please follow the most recent APA style guidelines. Manuscripts on literature and cultural studies should follow the most recent MLA style manual. The accuracy of cited material is the responsibility of the author as the editors and readers will not have the opportunity to verify quotes and citations included in the manuscript.

Before submission, the corresponding author has to make sure that all the authors of the article are included in the submission, that the order in which they appear has been agreed upon by all authors, and that all authors are aware that the paper was submitted.

After acceptance, the proof will be sent to the corresponding author at the e-mail address indicated in the submission. S/he will deal with HSR on behalf of all co-authors. After publication, the HSR will not necessarily correct errors if they were present on the proof that was shown to the co-authors before publication and were not indicated by the authors as errors to be corrected. The corresponding author is responsible for making sure that all names of co-authors are included in the final article, correctly spelled, and that affiliations are rightly attributed and current.

### **Manuscript file guidelines**

The manuscript file will include abstract, text, footnotes, tables, images, bibliographical references, and a short bibliographical note (max. 100 words) for each author. Additionally, all tables and images should also be sent as separate files, numbered as they appear in the manuscript. Images should be TIFF or JPEG files in grayscale, black and white, or colors, with a minimum resolution of 500 dpi. Please use only footnotes instead of endnotes.

### **Bibliographical references guidelines**

Authors should follow the APA style manual, 6th edition with one exception: all author/editor first names should be spelled out. Information about the APA style can be found [www.apastyle.org](http://www.apastyle.org).
